



Dear Parents,

No “lion”! “Ewe” and your little ones will enjoy springing into March with these thematic lion and lamb activities! *Wild and Woolly* is the name of our theme. The preschoolers will be introduced to the wacky weather of March by explaining the old saying, “March comes in like a lion and goes out like a lamb.” We’ll discuss the characteristics of lions (wild and loud) and lambs (quiet and gentle). I’ll explain that March’s weather is wild and ferocious like a lion one day and then gentle and quiet like a lamb the next.



Throughout the month of March we’ll be tracking the weather with lion and lamb calendar numbers. Each day we’ll decide, “Is it a lion day (cold, windy) or a lamb day (warm, sunny)?” At the end of the month we will graph to see if there were more lion days or lamb days.

Let’s see what Monday the 1<sup>st</sup> brings. This theme definitely lends itself to some predicting with the children too.

We will roar into math with lion and lamb patterning and counting.

**Color: Green**

**Numbers: 11 and 12**



**Shape: oval**
